NOTABLE CASES

- R v N Unanimous acquittal in importation of 5kg heroin and 25kg cannabis.
- R v B Instructed as junior to Nadine Radford QC in large-scale theft from employer case involving a particularly demanding client, the investigation of psychiatric issues, previous settlement in the High Court resulting in restrained assets. The case has attracted a large amount of publicity throughout the proceedings. Acted alone in two and a half day contested confiscation proceedings with overall benefit figure in the region of £2.5 million.
- R v O'G Junior to Daniel Flahive in multi-handed conspiracy to defraud clearing banks of some £3 million.
- R v H Instructed as junior alone to represent a company director alleged to have continued to trade after insolvency proceedings had commenced.
- R v S Instructed as junior alone in multi-handed conspiracy to defraud employers.
- R v A Successful submission of no case to answer in a violent disorder trial involving 6 defendants.
- R v L Successful 'Special Reasons' argument advanced in a matter involving driving whilst unfit through drink.
- R v H Conditional discharge imposed as re-sentence for a breach of a Drug Treatment and Testing Order with ASRO requirement.
- R v R Successful appeal against sentence to the Court of Appeal for possession with intent to supply heroin.
- R v L Led Junior in conspiracy to kidnap, possession of firearms and false imprisonment. The matter was featured on **BBC's Crimewatch UK**. Suspended sentence imposed following acceptable limited basis of plea.
- R v S 10 months detention and training order imposed for possession with intent to supply of heroin and crack cocaine.
